

SUSAN M. GILLES

Professor Emeritus John E. Sullivan Designated Professor of Law **Susan M. Gilles** has been a member of Capital's law faculty since 1990. She teaches civil procedure, torts, media law, and professional responsibility. A highly regarded teacher by both her students and colleagues, Professor Gilles is known for energy and creativity in the classroom, her ability to connect with her students and inspire them to succeed, and her willingness to share her knowledge and teaching methods as a mentor to junior faculty.

Professor Gilles is a nationally recognized scholar in the First Amendment/media law area. She has authored numerous articles that have appeared in prestigious journals, including the *Supreme Court Review*, *Marquette Law Review*, *Nebraska Law Review*, *Wake Forest Law Review*, *Temple Law Review*, *Ohio State Law Journal* and *Case Western Reserve Law Review*. Her scholarship is frequently cited by other authors and referenced in prominent law journals such as Stanford, Columbia and Georgetown, as well as three casebooks.

As an engaged member of the Law School and legal communities, Professor Gilles has taken on leadership roles on many important Law School committees, including issues related to strategic planning, academic affairs, faculty hiring and bar success and she has served on the University's assessment and strategic planning committees. In the legal community, she is a frequent speaker for the Ohio Judicial College and an invited presenter for a variety of law school symposia. She is also a former chair of the Association of American Law Schools Section on Mass Communication.

Professor Gilles has been a visiting professor at American University and Washington & Lee University. Prior to entering academia, she was an attorney with Baker and Hostetler, where her practice focused on media law and litigation. She holds a Master of Laws from Harvard Law School, where she was a John F. Kennedy Memorial Scholar, and a Bachelor of Laws from the University of Glasgow, Scotland.
