

SALI FAQ for Obtaining Credit from Your Home Institution

The following points should prove helpful in obtaining approval from your home institution to attend SALI.

- Capital University Law School is an ABA accredited school.
- SALI, though taught in an intensive format, is a traditional law school course and is part of Capital University Law School's standard curriculum
- The course is taught by tenured faculty member and Associate Professor of Law, Angela Upchurch. Her bio and credentials can be found at:

- The in-class hours meet the ABA requirements for a two-credit hour class.
- The course is open to all law students currently enrolled in a law school. There is no prerequisite or corequisite required for this course. While the course covers topics related to Constitutional Law, students need not have completed this course prior to taking SALI.
- A take-home exam is distributed at the conclusion of the class. Students return the exam shortly after the completion of the course. All students receive a letter grade.
- We are willing to assist you by providing any necessary documentation to your home institution for the approval of transfer credits.
