

Jeffrey T. Ferriell

Professor Jeff Ferriell grew up in Columbus, Ohio and Hayward, California. While a law student at Santa Clara University, he was a Comments Editor of the Santa Clara Law Review, Chairperson of the Moot Court Board, and was recognized as the Outstanding Graduate of the Class of 1978.

Professor Ferriell joined the Capital faculty in 1987. He also regularly teaches at the Moritz College of Law at the Ohio State University. He has variously taught at the University of Illinois College of Law, Santa Clara University, Ohio Northern University, the University of San Diego. At Capital he teaches Contracts, Secured Transactions, and Debtors' & Creditors' Rights. He has also taught Antitrust, Bankruptcy Reorganizations, Payment Systems, Consumer Law, Federal Courts, Legal Research & Writing, Legal Analysis Real Estate Finance, and Professional Responsibility. He served as advisor to Capital's National Moot Court Team from 1987-2003.

Professor Ferriell is the co-author of "Understanding Contracts" (Lexis/Nexis 2004) (with former Penn State/Dickinson Law School Professor Mike Navin) and "Understanding Bankruptcy" (Lexis/Nexis 2007) (with Brooklyn Law School Professor Ted Janger). These books are published by as part of Lexis/Nexis' "Understanding" series of law school hornbooks. Ferriell is also the author of a two-volume treatise on the Uniform Commercial Code in Ohio, "Baldwin's Ohio Practice, Commercial Code" (West 1996), as well as numerous articles on bankruptcy law and jurisdiction.

Professor Ferriell was appointed by Ohio Governor Ted Strickland to the Ohio Board of Uniform State Laws. This appointment makes Ferriell a member of Ohio's delegation to the National Conference of Commissioners on Uniform State Laws (NCCUSL). NCCUSL, together with the American Law Institute (ALI) is responsible for the promulgation and revision of a wide variety of model and uniform state statutes, including the Uniform Commercial Code, the Uniform Arbitration Act, the Uniform Partnership Act, and recently, the Uniform Rules Relating to Discovery of Electronically Stored Information.

Professor Ferriell received his LL.M. from the University of Illinois, his J.D., summa cum laude, from Santa Clara University and his B.S. from The Ohio State University.

Professor Ferriell has been licensed to practice in California since 1978 where he worked, for a short time, with the firm of Caldecott, Phillips & Downey, in the San Francisco Bay Area. His personal interests include bicycle racing and he holds an Extra Class FCC amateur radio license (K8ZDA).
