Professor Grant joined Capital in 2008. He teaches Property and Estates and Trusts. He previously served as an Assistant Professor of Law at the Appalachian School of Law, and as a Lecturer in Law at West Virginia University College of Law. Professor Grant has taught courses on Secured Transactions, Estate Planning (including Gift and Estate Taxation), Federal Income Taxation, Legal Process, and Legal Research and Writing. His areas of research and writing include business entity choice and succession planning, taxation of trusts and individuals, estate planning, technology and the law, and issues of diversity in the legal profession.

Professor Grant's bar admissions include the Ohio Supreme Court, District of Columbia Court of Appeals, United States Court of Appeals, Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals, United States District Court and the Northern District of Ohio. He is a member of the American, Ohio State and District of Columbia Bar Associations.

Active in the legal community, Professor Grant also serves as Pro Bono General Counsel for the Alabama-Greene County Civic & Social Club, on the ASL Sutin/Blackwell Committee for Law, Art, and the Community, on the board of trustees for the West Virginia Alzheimer's Association Regional Council, the Home Repair Resource Center, and Omni Resources, Inc. In addition, he contributes as a mentor or volunteer attorney at numerous community and educational organizations.

Professor Grant's interests include international relations, politics, classical history, architecture, genealogy, and cattle ranching. He has traveled extensively throughout the United States, Mexico, Europe, and the South Pacific.

Professor Grant earned his J.D. from Duke University School of Law. He holds an A.B. from Brown University and a Certificate from the University of London, Queen Mary and Westfield College.
