The Procession

THE FACULTY MARSHAL

The procession is led by the faculty marshal, a senior Law School faculty member.

THE DEAN'S GROUP

The Dean's group includes the faculty marshal, the Dean, the President, the Provost, the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs, a member of the clergy, the class valedictorian, a member of the University Board of Trustees, and the commencement speaker.

THE FACULTY AND ADMINISTRATION

The ascending tenure-track/tenured faculty ranks include assistant, associate, and professor of Law. Additional faculty ranks include professor of Academic Success, professor of Bar Studies, professor of Clinical Studies, and professor of Legal Writing. Members of the Law School senior administration hold the titles of assistant dean and director. The arrangement of faculty and administrators in the procession, however, does not reflect rank or title.

Mitch H. Melfi, Esq., L'84

**Senior Executive Vice President and Chief Legal Officer
CommonSpirit Health**

Mitch Melfi is the senior executive vice president and chief legal officer for Chicago-based CommonSpirit Health, created by the merger of Catholic Health Initiatives and Dignity Health. In his current role, Mr. Melfi provides oversight for legal services, including legal mergers and acquisitions, Enterprise Risk Management, corporate governance matters, and sponsorship.

At the time of the merger, Mr. Melfi served as the executive vice president, Corporate Affairs, and chief legal officer for CHI. He also held other positions for CHI, including senior vice president and general counsel, senior vice president and chief risk officer, and president and CEO of First Initiatives Insurance, LTD. Prior to CHI, Mr. Melfi was the vice president, associate general counsel, and acting general counsel for the Sisters of Charity Health Care System in Cincinnati, Ohio, until it merged with two other Catholic health systems to form CHI. Prior to his move to Cincinnati, Mr. Melfi served on the executive management team for Children's Hospital in Columbus, Ohio, where he oversaw all legal operations.

Mr. Melfi has authored several publications, spoken on legal and risk management topics for lawyers, physicians, nurses, risk managers, and other allied healthcare professionals, and provided consulting services in various areas of risk management and loss prevention.

He taught at The Ohio State University College of Medicine and served as a guest lecturer at Capital University Law School. He serves on the boards of directors of several organizations, including health care systems, insurance companies, and internal audit firms.

Mr. Melfi received his bachelor's degree from The Ohio State University and his juris doctor degree from Capital University Law School.

ACADEMIC HERALDRY

REGALIA

Since the 14th century, scholars have displayed academic achievement by wearing caps, gowns, and hoods. Gowns for the Juris Doctor display broad velvet panels down the front and three velvet bars on the full, round, open sleeves. The hood, worn over the doctoral gown, gives additional color and meaning to the academic costume. A black shell lined with the colors of the institution conferring the degree, in this case purple and white, the hood is bordered in velvet in the color of the field of study. The velvet trim in purple on both the gown and hood signifies the Juris Doctor degree.

All graduates are hooded during the commencement ceremony, most by members of the faculty. It is tradition at Capital to extend an invitation to any graduate to be hooded by a family member or mentor who also holds a Juris Doctor degree.

Some graduates wear stoles or cords with their regalia to represent the organizations they were involved with while in law school. Moot Court & Mock Trial advocates who have participated for two years wear a silver stole; those who have participated for one year wear a silver cord. The executive board members of the ACLU wear a blue-and-white intertwined cord. Women's Law Association members wear a lavender cord, and executive board members wear a white stole with purple trim. Criminal Law Association executive board members wear a black stole, and members wear a baby-blue cord. Environmental & Energy Law Society members wear a green cord. Members of the Black Law Students Association wear a stole made of Kente cloth. Hispanic Law Student Association members wear a cord in cyan, rose, and yellow. Executive members of the Student Bar Association Governing Board wear purple stoles, and board members wear purple cords. The members of the Capital University Law Review wear intertwined gold-and-white cords, and the executive and associate boards wear gold-and-white stoles.

MACE

The University Mace is carried by the Faculty Marshal in the processional and recession. It was originally derived from a medieval weapon representing the need to protect and nurture the fragile search for knowledge. Over the centuries, it has become a symbol of order and authority. Today, the Mace has a place in many of the university's ceremonies, signifying the beginning and end of the event.



Capital University and Capital University Law School

Founded in 1830, Capital University is Central Ohio's oldest university, offering a personal, career-connected education in the heart of Columbus, Ohio.
