Exam conflicts are not resolved automatically. Students must request rescheduling for any qualifying conflict under Section 4.8.02. When a 24- hour conflict exists, the rescheduled exam will be moved to the earliest available make-up date following the conflicting exam that does not create a new conflict with the student's other exams. Students with exam conflicts should be advised that make-up exams may be scheduled any time during the exam period (including the weekend) and should plan accordingly.
