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SUMMER SCHEDULE NOTES

3-credit hour courses	If they meet twice a week, meet for 10 weeks from May 19 to July 25, with the final exam a week after the last class, and grades due August 10. If classes meet on one of the three holidays listed below, then classes extend up to August 1, with the final exam a week after the last class, and grades due August 15.
2-credit hour courses	If they meet twice a week, meet for 7 weeks, from May 19 to July 4, with final exam a week after the last class, and grades due July 18. If classes meet on one of the three holidays listed below, then classes extend up to July 11, with final exam a week after the last class, and grades due July 25.
	If they meet once a week, meet for 10 weeks, from May 19 to July 25, with the final exam a week after the last class, and grades due August 8. If classes meet on one of the three holidays listed below, then classes extend up to August 1, with the final exam a week after the last class, and grades due August 15.
Courses noted with *	These courses will satisfy the Upper-Level Writing graduation requirement but not the Perspective requirement, so long as the grade earned is a "C" or better. Note that Appellate Advocacy may satisfy either the Upper-Level Writing graduation requirement or the Experiential Learning graduation requirement but not both.
Hybrid Courses	Hybrid courses will have both asynchronous and remote learning elements, with the frequency of in-person learning based on pedagogical needs. While the frequency of in-person class meetings may vary by course, those meetings will take place as it currently appears on the schedule.
