These classes are Bank/ Clinic usually scheduled to start on the first Thursday immediately following the start of our regular Wednesday Williamson class for approximately 7 consecutive weekday mornings from 7:30 AM to 8:50 AM. We have scheduled (2 cr) these early morning classes during the first two weeks of school in an effort to avoid interfering with established schedules. VITA is a one-credit course that will meet from 9:00 AM to 11:00 AM on four consecutive Saturdays: 943-1: Volunteer Income January 10, January 17, January 24, and January 31. Students will then be required to meet the clinic portion of the course as assigned by the professor, including 20 hours of class time. Clinic hours will be Tax Assistance (VITA) Hoover assigned on Saturdays (February 7th through April 4th; closed for the Saturdays of Spring break) from 8:30 (1 cr) AM to 1:30 PM. To be enrolled in the externship course, students must apply through the Office of Professional Development and be approved by Assistant Dean Beem. Students are unable to enroll in the course via 944: Externships myCap. Students may seek 2 or 3 credits of externship during the spring semester. This course does not Beem meet for a regular weekly class session. Approved students will complete course orientation and DEI (2/3 cr) training via asynchronous learning videos, submit course assignments via Canvas, and meet in person with their assigned faculty supervisor on two occasions scheduled via Canvas. The professor will contact students prior to the first week of class to schedule two class meetings. The professor will attempt to schedule the two classes at a time convenient to all parties. The first-class meeting, which will be held at the law school, will involve a review of the course syllabus along with other course forms and a skills review using mock mediations. This first meeting is usually 3-4 hours in length. The second-class meeting of about two hours will be held at the Franklin County Municipal Court so students can meet the staff of the small claims court and the prosecutor's office as well as the magistrates of the small claims court. Most of the remainder of "class time" will be spent conducting and/or observing 941-1: Mediation Clinic Wheeler mediations in the small claims court in the afternoons from about 1:15 PM to 4:00 PM on Tuesdays, (3 cr) Wednesdays and/or Thursdays. Students only need to be available one afternoon on a Tuesday, Wednesday OR Thursday. Limited mediation opportunities are available in the prosecutor's office starting at either 5:00 PM or 6:00 PM on select evenings. Students may also have opportunities to observe mediations at other locations such as the Ohio Civil Rights Commission and the Franklin County Domestic Relations Court Mediation Program. One-hour Zoom classes will be held throughout the semester at times convenient to students and professor. Questions should be directed to Professor Terry Wheeler.
